

HOW TO BENEFIT

Report to the BEPHA Representative in the Partner Health Unit of your choice with your BEPHA Card, collect a Treatment Form, Consult and get prescription and/ or treatment, pay 25% and collect drugs then sign necessary documents.

WAITING PERIOD:

This is the period of maturity for a benefit. It starts when the Member completes paying his/her Annual Contribution. It varies as follows:

- ✍ 1 month for Consultation
- ✍ 1 month for Hospitalization
- ✍ 6 months for Deliveries
- ✍ 6 months for Surgical Operations.

As soon as the waiting period is over, a Beneficiary Card will be issued. Each time this card is to be used it must be verified at the partner Health Institution.

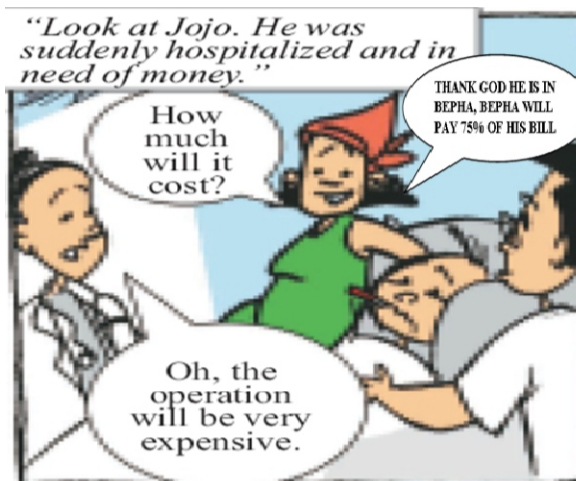

WHAT IS BEPHA?

It is a Church based solidarity non-profit making Health Assistance scheme, which provides financial assistance against health related risks.

It is promoted by the Bishops of the Ecclesiastical Province of Bamenda (made up of the Dioceses of Buea, Bamenda, Mamfe and Kumbo) as part of their Evangelizing Mission and also as their contribution in the fight against Misery caused by Poverty.

It enables adherents to have access to **quality** health care and 75% reduction of their health bills.

BEPHA'S MISSION

- To encourage people to pre-save for their health and that of their families.
- To encourage people to go for medical care on time in order to safeguard against early deaths.
- To assist people to have access to quality health care.
- Help relief families from straining financially on health problems and thus exhausting the family income meant for feeding and education on their sick ones.
- To check inflated bills and avoid exploitation of patient.

BEPHA EXCEPTIONS OR EXCLUSIONS:

- ✍ Special diets, food supplements and food from hospital canteen.
- ✍ Major Orthopaedic, plastic and/or Cosmetic surgeries.
- ✍ Major Gynaecological, Radiological investigations.
- ✍ Chronic Renal Dialysis, Cytotoxic drugs and Radiotherapy.
- ✍ Cardiovascular, Diabetic, and Hypertensive conditions.
- ✍ Specialist Consultations, Brand-name (Specialised) Drugs.
- ✍ Lenses, Dentures, Crutches, Wheel Chairs, Files, Medical Certificates, etc.
- ✍ Private Wards, Transportation costs, School Infirmarys, Routine check-ups.
- ✍ Epidemics, Natural disasters/Catastrophes and wars
- ✍ Tertiary specialised care such as: Heart Transplant, Hipbone Replacement, etc.
- ✍ Elective Abortion, Contraceptive Surgery, etc.

WHO CAN BE A MEMBER?

- ✍ Family and Household Members
- ✍ Social, Cultural (Tribal meetings, etc) and Religious Groups or Associations.
- ✍ Socio-economic Groups (NJANGIs, CIGs, NGOs, etc)
